Hiawatha Parks and Recreation Regular Meeting March 14, 2017

Deb Theis called the meeting to order at 6:04p.m. in the Hiawatha Council Chambers. Present: Dan Gogel, Deb Theis, Dan Wilkes, Dawn Ewoldt Employees: Kelly Willadsen, Parks and Recreation Director, Ambyr Young, Administrative Coordinator, Kim Downs, City Administrator, Bill Bennett, Mayor. Motion by Dan Wilkes, second by Dan Gogel to approve the March 14, 2017 agenda as amended. Motion carried.

Motion by Dan Wilkes, second by Dan Gogel to approve the minutes of February 14, 2017. Motion carried.

Amateur Radio Field Day June 23rd - 25th, 2017:

ARRL Field Day is the most popular on-the-air event held annually in the US and Canada. On the fourth weekend of June, more than 35,000 radio amateurs gather with their clubs, groups or simply with friends to operate from remote locations. Field Day is an education event that is self sufficient and teaches Amateurs to operate in abnormal situations in case of emergency instances. June 23-25th a local Amateur Group in the Hiawatha/Cedar Rapids area would like to use Clark Park as a designated location. With that said it would require that the park stay open 24 hours, past our 10PM curfew. There would be 24 hours shifts that these Amateurs would cover to connect with as many stations as possible that weekend (the whole objective of the event). The park would still be open to the public besides the disc golf course. They would need to set up portable antennas that would be between 30-40ft high. This group carries insurance and is very self efficient. This year the Hiawatha Fire Department will not be involved so we will be asking for a \$1,000.00 refundable damage deposit along with the Clark Pavilion Rental. I would like your approval for this event to take place in the park on June 23-25th and to extend park hours for the length of this event.

Kona requested by the Arc for Sunday Fun Day event on September 17th, 2017:

The Arc of East Central Iowa would like to request that Kona Ice of Cedar Rapids be onsite at their annual Sunday Fun Day event on Sunday, September 17th, 2017 from 1-3pm. They would like to provide a treat that is sugar, gluten and nut free which Kona Ice provides. The Arc works with developmental disabilities and people that need to follow strict dietary guidelines. They have already rented a park pavilion for their event. Kona would only be able to serve to the Arc's event guests.

HKL request to install solar panel on concession stand:

The Hiawatha Kids League has applied for a grant through Rockwell Collins to acquire a small solar panel device and power supply with the intent to install on the Guthridge Park concession stand. This would power the refrigeration units, lighting and popcorn machine. HKL will find out if the grant is approved on April 21st. My concerns with this project are that they use the concession stand for about three months out of the year and we cannot guarantee that there will not be any damage done by park users. They currently pay on average about \$300.00 per month during the usage of the concession stand. They will not see a cost savings right away but over time.

Replacement Lawn Mower Bids: It is that time again to replace our park mowers in FY18. Our mowers are in the equipment reserve fund that rotates every three years. We do this to keep our equipment up to date so that we can sell at a reasonable price and not have to put money into the equipment as it gets older. We have sought out three companies for bids that you will see below.

We will be replacing the #360 Zero Turn Scag in FY18 for a new Scag replacement. We would like to place this mower on Craig's List for a minimum bid of \$5,500.00 with the funding going back into the equipment reserve. If we traded the mower in, we would only be receiving \$4,000.00.

The parks staff will also be replacing the 2009 Landpride Flex Mower (Batwing). We kept this on the reserve for an additional three years in FY15 and is now time to be replaced. We have had to start putting funds towards this piece of equipment over the last year. We will be trading this piece of equipment in for the value of \$5,500.00.

On the matrix provided you will see the three different bids we received from Rexco, P & K Midwest and Midway Outdoor Equipment for the Scag. You will see Rexco, P&K Midwest and Kromminga for the Landpride Batwing. We chose P&K Midwest Inc. for both not only because they came in the lowest, but they will also be able to provide us with the two new pieces of equipment on July 1st, will give us a replacement piece if maintenance will take longer than 24 hours and they are located here in Hiawatha.

We would like to ask for your recommendation to place our current Scag on Craig's List accepting

minimum bids of \$5,500.00 and approving P&K Midwest Inc. bid to purchase one new Scag mower for 9,803.46 and one new Landpride Flex Mower (Batwing) for \$7,400.00 out of reserve dollars. Your recommendation will go to the June 21st Council Meeting for approval.




