## VOLUNTEER AT THE HIAWATHA PUBLIC LIBRARY

### Purpose and Intent

The Hiawatha Public Library uses volunteers to supplement the efforts of paid staff in providing quality public service. Volunteers are viewed as important liaisons between the library and the community. Through its volunteer services program, the library seeks to develop a group of citizens who can assist the library in interpreting its needs to the community. Volunteers also keep the library in touch with the community it serves. Volunteer workers do not substitute for paid staff but assist with programs or projects that supplement or complement staff duties.

### Definition

A "volunteer" is defined as a person who, of their own volition provides services to the Hiawatha Public Library without compensation.

### Eligibility

Participants who provide volunteer services to the Hiawatha Public Library must be at least 12 years of age. The National Sex Abuse Registry and Iowa Sex Abuse Registry will be checked for all applicants. Any applicant with a criminal history for sex or child abuse convictions, or who is serving community service to satisfy a conviction for theft, fraud, forgery or violence will automatically be denied volunteer placement.

### Supervision

Volunteers at the Hiawatha Public Library are considered to be under staff supervision. Supervision will be provided by all HPL staff on duty. All staff will be responsible for training and direct oversight of a volunteer's performance.

### Dismissal

Volunteers may be terminated for failure to perform assigned job duties, failure to meet minimum standards of performance, or for violations of library rules. The library staff reserves the right to dismiss a volunteer at any time.

### Medication Disposal by Blairs Ferry Family Pharmacy

Unneeded or expired prescriptions left in homes can lead to accidental poisonings and can be an easy source for those seeking to misuse or abuse prescription medications. Blairs Ferry Family Pharmacy has partnered with City of Hiawatha to protect your families and take back your unneeded or expired medications and properly dispose of them. Prescription medications, patches, ointments, medication for pets, and over-the-counter drugs will be accepted. Items like syringes, inhalers and aerosols will not be accepted.

### Glasses & Hearing Aid Disposal by Hiawatha Lions Club

Everyday, recycled eyeglasses help children read, adults succeed and seniors maintain their independence. Recycled hearing aids are refurbished to meet the needs of those hard of hearing locally, sent with hearing care professionals on mission trips to developing nations or credited for parts which in turn is applied towards the purchase of new hearing aids for persons who have limited abilities to pay. Please donate your unwanted eyeglasses and hearing aids to help those in need.

### Electronic Recovery – Midwest Electronic Recovery

Midwest Electronic Recovery has partnered with the City of Hiawatha to collect your unwanted, outdated, broken or simply unused electronic equipment.

Items accepted at this event: Personal computers/laptops, monitors, keyboards & mice, printers, copiers, networking hardware, disc drives, servers & mainframes, computer manuals, software, televisions, VCR's & DVD's, audio/visual equipment, stereos, telephones, fax machines, circuit boards, cable & satellite equipment, computer cables & wires & other electronic equipment.

Electronic equipment from businesses is **not** accepted at this event. Businesses should contact Midwest Electronic Recovery for more information at 319-845-2001.

### LEAVES, BRUSH & YARD WASTE COLLECTION

Leaves and yard waste must be put in paper bags and placed curbside by 7:00 AM on Monday, April 25, 2022. Crews will not collect brush or branches larger than 12" in diameter and will not collect tree demolition. All other branches should be spread along the curb to facilitate easier pickup. Do not stack them.

### Document Shredding by Heartland Shredding, Inc.

The City of Hiawatha, in conjunction with Heartland Shredding, wants to help protect you from identity theft by providing you with an opportunity to shred unwanted documents. There will be a limit of 5 grocery bags per person and documents will be shredded on site. Vehicles will need to remain until their documents have been shredded. Documents for shredding need NOT be free of staples, paper clips or binder clips. You may also include a limited quantity of floppy diskettes and CD's.

### Flag Disposal by Hiawatha Legion Post #735

Because we all know that flying or displaying a flag with damages or tears is considered a sign of disrespect, the Hiawatha Legion Post #735 has kindly offered their assistance in flag disposal. Hiawatha Legion Post #735 will accept all flags; Federal, State and POW. Bring your unserviceable flags for proper disposal. Hiawatha Legion Post #735 may also be offering new flags for purchase.

### AMNESTY COLLECTION - MAY 9, 2022

Please have items placed by the curb before 7:00 AM

#### ALLOWED:

- Broken glass placed in a plastic bucket or other suitable container. Windows and doors with broken glass will not be collected.
- Small items placed in trash cans or plastic bags. Mark trash cans with a red "X" if they are to be discarded
- Large items other than doors or furniture, nothing longer than 4' will be collected. Please cut railroad ties, plastic, lumber, carpet and drywall in no larger than 4' lengths and tie in bundles. No large demolition project debris. Please remove nails, screws and all hardware from lumber, trim pieces, drywall, etc.
- Metal and appliances need to be placed curbside separate from other items as they will be collected by a different crew.

#### NOT ALLOWED:

- Waste oil & solvents
  - Batteries
  - Deposit beverage containers
  - Pressurized tanks
  - Cans with undried paint
  - Cardboard
  - Florescent bulbs
  - TV's and Computer monitors (take these to Earth Day on April 23rd!)

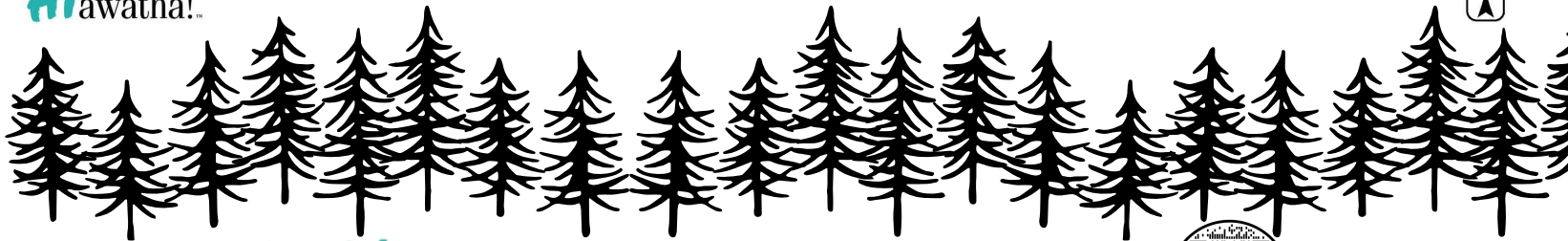

## HiAWATHA ADOPT A STREET TREE PROGRAM



We need your help rebuilding our urban canopy! Hiawatha lost nearly 600 right-of-way trees. As part of the Derecho recovery efforts, Hiawatha has made replanting trees a priority over the next several years.

Simple acts of stewardship go a long way! Help Hiawatha replant so we can enjoy the numerous benefits that a lush urban canopy provides!

We invite you to plant a **FREE** street tree in the right-of-way of your residence. These trees are provided through Alliant Energy Branching Out grant and Local Option Sales Tax Dollars with limited quantity available. First come first served!

The primary goal of the Adopt a Street Tree program is to help plant new trees in the Hiawatha Community. Caring for the newly planted tree during its first four to five years increases the likelihood of its survival. Your assistance helps rebuild the city canopy while helping City Staff with tree maintenance needs. We have included a list of the essential do's and don'ts involved in the Adopt a Street Tree Program.

**Do:**

- Plant a Tree
- Water
- Mulch

**Don't:**

- Prune
- Fertilize
- Build a wall or raised bed around the tree
