### Hiawatha Parks and Recreation Regular Meeting November 14, 2017

Deb Theis called the meeting to order at 6:08p.m. in the Hiawatha Council Chambers. Present: Brandon Lynch, Deb Theis, Dawn Ewoldt Absent: Dan Wilkes, Dan Gogel and Employees: Kelly Willadsen, Parks and Recreation Director, Ambyr Young, Administrative Coordinator, Kim Downs, City Administrator, Bill Bennett, Mayor. Guests: Dan Hoffman.

Motion by Dawn Ewoldt, second by Brandon Lynch to approve the November 14, 2017 agenda as amended. Motion carried. Motion by Brandon Lynch, second by Dawn Ewoldt to approve the minutes of October 10, 2017. Motion carried.

Community Center Damage Deposit Price Increase: After last month's meeting, the board asked Ambyr and Kelly to consider increasing the Community Center damage deposit to see if it helps keep renters more accountable for cleanup. Since there has been quite a few rentals over the last two months that have not seemed to care, the department would like to increase the damage deposit to \$300. This would become effective January 1, 2018.

Motion by Dawn Ewoldt, second by Brandon Lynch to increase the damage deposit to \$300 effective January 1, 2018. Motion carried.

**HiCREW Kiwanis request for 2018 concessions:** Hi-CREW Kiwanis would like to work the concessions at Music in the Park for 2018. Hi-CREW Kiwanis sold at Music in the Park and met all the requirements set by this policy. There has not been any other nonprofit interest.

Volunteer Background Check Update: The Library and Parks and Recreation Department have been working together to create a volunteer background check so that to do things the same across the board. This will be used for recreation volunteer coaches and any long-term volunteers. Mark Parmenter, the City Attorney has looked this over and agrees that both departments should be taking the same steps.

Handicap Parking in Guthridge Park: During the Farmers Market and other special events, the department would like to move the handicap spots that are located in the middle section of the 10<sup>th</sup> avenue parking lot and move them to the first lot on the right. Some individuals have gotten upset about the blocking of accessibility, along with close call accidents from people backing into the vendors. This will alleviate closing handicap spots during special events and adding the same amount 10 feet over.

### Reports:

• Fall Festival Recap- It may have been a chilly year but it didn't keep the families from coming out to the last farmers market and Fall Festival. There were about 25 vendors handing out candy to the kids. Since this was the 3<sup>rd</sup> year majority of the vendors dressed up and got in the Halloween spirit! Prestige Dance Studio performed on stage followed by a costume contest put on by the HiCREW Kiwanis Club. Mike Nesslage the Hiawatha Fire Chief, Kelly Kornegor, City Clerk and

Stephen Robert, the Hiawatha Elementary Principle helped judge the contest for the most original, scariest, and funniest costumes. There was an inflatable sponsored by Farmers State Bank, along with a Pumpkin Bean Bag Toss and a Snoopy hole in the wall photo opportunity. ImOn Communications did a craft with the kids making Halloween Bags and Awaken Family Chiropractic put on a coloring contest. The department is very pleased with the community involvement with this event and look forward to making the event bigger every year. Thank you Dawn, Dan G. and Debby for helping at the event.

### Reports:

- **Program Brochure 2018:** The 2018 Program Brochure was sent in to get printed on January 3rd. Once we get the brochures in we will distribute them around town and to the Hiawatha Schools and sponsors. All the programs are available online to register for 2018 starting January 8th! We are keeping our fingers crossed that the website will work efficiently this year.

Michelle has a Bachelor of Science degree in Psychology and a Master of Business Administration, both from the University of Iowa. Originally from a smallish town near Rockford, Illinois, she has been a proud Hiawatha resident for nearly 7 years and has lived in the Cedar Rapids area for 20 years. She loves Hiawatha because it has a small-town feel (it's awesome to have lengthy conversations about nothing with the city hall staff when you go to pay your water bill), the best parks this side of the Atlantic Ocean, and easy access to anything you could possibly need in life. Her family includes her husband Jens, who likes to keep a low profile but easily puts up with his wife's shenanigans; their son Luke, who is almost 9 and plans to be President someday (maybe mayor of Hiawatha?); three rescue cats; and a big dumb dog who likes to escape the house and take himself for walks in the neighborhood every once in a while. Her hobbies include running, crocheting, not cooking, and driving Luke in circles around Hiawatha so he can get to all his camps, practices, and playdates on time.

### Parks:

- Tree Trimming/Removal: Ted and the streets department are busy trimming trees and removing trees that are dead or a safety concern. We have applied for another Branching Out Grant and Tree Please Grant which will be used to replanting trees that were removed.
- **Snow Removal:** Ted has been busy plowing and removing snow, with Rick currently out until the spring we are down one guy keeping everyone extra busy!
- Dog Park Update: To dispose of Kainz Park in swaps of building a dog park with Dave Wrights land and Linn County, there are certain hoops we have to jump through in order to acquire the appropriate land. The property is somewhat unique in that within the warranty deed of Kainz park (and the surrounding three lots) there are two restrictions placed on the parcel. The first restriction says the parcel needs to stay in the City of Hiawatha's name and to be used for public purpose. The second says if at any time the city no longer wants to use either parcel for public purpose the land would automatically be transferred back to Linn County.

In our efforts to form a public, public, partnership to establish a dog park, Linn County requested we quit claim deed the four lots back to them (Kainz park and the surrounding 3 lots) which was approved at the December  $20^{th}$  meeting.

Linn County will then hold the necessary public hearings and consider exchanging the deeded four lots in exchange for Dave Wrights parcel east of the Cedar Valley Nature Trail adjacent to the County parcel to the south (where the future dog park development will occur).

With this exchange the County will maintain certain restrictions on the 4 lots keeping the public purpose requirements and maintaining current separation to the residential properties (currently there). In January, Linn County will then convey Dave Wrights parcel east of the Cedar Valley Trail to the City of Hiawatha for \$1.00. The land will hold similar restriction as the previous 4 lots currently did for public purpose and/or use. The City would then take Dave Wrights parcel and the parcel east of the Cedar Valley Trail to be used for a small and large dog park.

We hope we can get a start on the dog park project development come this spring as long as Linn County passes all the necessary policies and procedures.




