With school already in session, all drivers are urged to "drive safe" and student pedestrians are urged to "be smart" and make safety a priority.

Here are some general safety tips:

Obey all traffic signals, signs and markings whether walking, bicycling, or driving.

- 2. The speed limit in Residential and School Zones is 25 miles per hour. You should drive with added caution when children are present.
- Do not park or stop to unload children in no parking zones or on the roadway. Use the school's designated drop off and pickup zone. This will help cut down on the potential for accidents during periods of congestion.
- Have your children enter and exit vehicles on the passenger side of the car and only in loading areas or next to the sidewalk when legally parked.
- 5. Remind your children to look in all directions before crossing the street.
- Cross the street only in a marked crosswalk or at a corner, not mid-block.
- 7. When riding a bicycle, you should always wear a helmet. If riding on the street, you ride your bike with the flow of traffic.

The Hiawatha Police Department monitors specific areas near Hiawatha and Nixon Elementary schools and violators will be issued citations for unsafe driving.

Robins Road Water Tower Painting Project



The water tower on Robins Road was built in 1970 and since then, the outside of the tower has been painted a number of times. But, it's been over ten years since the last time the outside of the tower was painted. The inside wet area of the tower has only been painted once since it was built and that was done in 1980.

Utility Service Company has been contracted to sandblast and paint the water tower. This work is scheduled to begin August 21, 2012, at which time the contractor will move in his equipment.

We will be taking the water tower out of service and will begin to drain it on August 22, 2012. Weather permitting, the tower should be back in service within 60 working days.

Hopefully the really hot weather has passed and we will have more seasonal weather as the city's water storage will be reduced during this time. The Water Department is asking its customers to please monitor their water usage over the span of this project.

The Boyson Road and Robins Road intersection project is scheduled to begin next spring. This project includes a widened intersection, sidewalks and traffic signals.
